- To redeploy the money spent on education
- To reshape the teaching force
- To reorganize the governance and administration of schools

Current Situation

Schools and higher education institutions,

- Isolated from and ignorant of each other
- Realizing how important they are to one another
- Have begun to rediscover one another
- Reassessed how well our two educational systems are performing

Mutualism

- Universities are the main consumers of the products of schools,
 - Universities need strong and successful schools in order to do a better job of educating their students
- The effective training of teachers by the universities determines the quality of teaching in the schools.

Some Issues...

- Questions about the quality of education in the schools as well as the universities
- The importance of school/college collaboration critical to the achievement of quality at both levels
- All of us, whatever our roles in education, have a stake in quality at all levels of our two systems

Some Postulates

- Formal education is a <u>continuum</u> and not three segments of elementary-secondary-higher education.
- Yet there seems to be a mysterious barrier that separates grades K-12 from higher education
- Attitudes toward school are basically formed in the elementary schools.
- Students who want to study in college the sciences or other technical fields, need a strong mathematics and science background in high school

The Relationship between the School and the University

- The upward flow of students connecting the school and the university
- A process of student selection and training.
- Increasing accessibility of the secondary school system pressuring the higher education to expand and diversify
- The downward flow of teachers, with their selection and training

How the School Shapes the University

- Principally by shaping the upward flow of students
- The main instruments of influence are curricular tracks and exit examinations

How the University Shapes the School

- Influence on the stream of teachers and administrators who pass through it on their way to staffing the schools
- The requirements it sets for student entry and successful performance

IB Schools for Anatolia by Bilkent University

- A bill was passed in the Turkish Parliament on July 12, 2006 as the Law # 5526
- Mandate to Bilkent University to establish campuses in four Anatolian provinces of Erzurum, Malatya, Urfa and Van
- Campuses would include high quality k-12 schools and graduate schools to train their teachers

The Rationale

- Attracting highly-qualified professionals to lesser developed parts of Turkey and keeping them there for a significant period of time
- To establish world-class elementary and secondary schools that will give very high quality education
- To transform a number of pilot cities into centers of attraction to work and reside in for families which consider giving their children their highest priority

How will the schools be?

- Equipping these schools with state-of-the-art facilities and infrastructure to give to students broad background in art, music, athletics, sciences as well as social and environmental areas and impart them competency in the areas they are naturally gifted
- The schools will offer curricula that will be accredited by globally recognized agencies
- Along with these schools, institutions of higher education will also be established to give initially graduate degrees to teachers

The Erzurum Experience

- Established in 2007 as a Senior High School
- A Rigorous Preparatory Year Curriculum
- A 2-Year IGCSE Curriculum followed by a month-long exams period- 15 exams
- A Two-Year IB Curriculum
- Bilkent Programs in Science , Arts and Music
- International Experience for Students


